What Does Zero Waste Mean?

Zero Waste has many definitions, but essentially zero waste refers to the philosophy of working towards **making as little waste as possible** with the ultimate goal of eliminating waste completely. The goal of reaching zero waste can be achieved through many different methods, including redesigning products & packaging, recycling, composting, repairing, reusing, donating, and waste-to-energy processes. Zero Waste examines the 'whole system' to find opportunities to minimize consumption, maximize resources, and reduce toxicity to humans and our environment.



The City of Gainesville has set a goal to go Zero Waste by 2040 by supporting policies needed to dramatically reduce waste and encourage citizens to rethink waste material flows.
