Please see the attached presentation that was given as the Community Update. The following input was gained from participants:

- One participant asked if the parking lot was changing or expanding. It was explained that the overall
 paved area of the parking lot will remain as is but will be resurfaced and restriped to provide five
 additional parking spaces. Additional parking options north of the multipurpose field and along NW
 13th Ave are also being explored.
- 2. It was asked if the Live Oaks west of the parking lot be preserved, to which the attendees were assured they would be.
- 3. There was a concern with proposed pedestrian-scale trail lighting regarding potential impacts to wildlife and adjacent homes. It was explained that lighting trails such as this is a general policy of the City as budget allows. Proposed lighting would be designed to be of a light level appropriate for trail use, which is lower than for parking lots and sports fields, and would meet the City's standards for light levels and cut off. Park hours are to 11:30pm by City ordinance unless otherwise posted at the park.
- 4. There were comments from a few participants (a couple of residents and representatives from the Historical Fencers group, etc.) requesting a multipurpose paved area similar to what existed between the tennis courts and racquetball, inquiring if it would it be possible to include such an open paved area and if it would it be possible to shade it. They were told that due to the need to keep the overall development footprint as small as possible to minimize impacts on wetlands and existing trees, and due to the need for eight courts, additional paved areas are not planned for this project.
- 5. Another attendee asked if there could be a wall be added for kids to throw a ball against, similar to what a participant observed per the previous racquetball court wall. It was explained that sight lines and overall security was a big consideration in the design of this project. A wall is not preferred due to concerns with blocking views.
- 6. There was a concern about the potential noise impacts of the project on adjacent homeowners. It was pointed out that acoustic fencing is proposed for the southern edge of the southernmost court. New landscaping, existing vegetation to remain, and the over 500 ft. distance between improvements and homes along 13th Ave. will assist to mitigate noise. Improvements are proposed in the area of the park furthest from the most homes.
- 7. There was a request to locate proposed dog park benches in the shade, which was a note taken by the project team.



- 8. There was general discussion of rotating gate use at the dog park to minimize erosion and impacts at high use gate areas. This item will be discussed with Parks staff.
- 9. The question was raised if the existing tennis courts are run by USTA. The answer is yes, the City partners with USTA for management of the courts.



Trees

- City Arborist on site review
- Made changes:
- Eliminated previously proposed seatwall
- Utilizing seating types that do not require footings near trees
- Moved proposed paving further away
- Selected more shallow paving types
- Eliminated the picnic pavilion
- Revised stormwater to save 14 trees

Wetlands

- Paving outside of 50 ft. wetland buffer










