
Sip & Stroll District Arts • Culture • Entertainment

What is the Sip & Stroll District? The Sip & Stroll Districts (also known as the arts, culture and entertainment districts) specifically delineate areas downtown, and within the commercial area of Grove Street, where customers may consume alcohol in public spaces inside district borders. The districts are allowable by the Gainesville Code of Ordinances, Sections 4-57 through 4-60.


Between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 midnight daily, patrons of legal drinking age may walk around with open containers of alcohol on public property within the Sip & Stroll Districts.

What happens if I'm outside district boundaries with open alcohol? Police officers may issue either civil citations or criminal infractions to those found in violation of the ordinances, as well as arrest disruptive individuals on criminal charges.

What is not allowed? Glass containers are prohibited at all times. Open containers are not allowed in public parking lots or garages, even if they are in the Sip & Stroll Districts.

Notice: Alcoholic beverage establishments shall post, at all points of egress from the licensed premises, a map of the boundaries of the arts, culture, and entertainment district in which it is located. Alcoholic beverage establishments shall also provide, either in electronic or paper form, a map of the arts, culture and entertainment district upon request.
