The City of Gainesville has already enacted a Single-Use Plastic Food Accessories By Request Only ordinance, so restaurants should not be providing unnecessary items by default.



- Breathe New Life Into Used Items Have you ever been to a Fix-It Clinic? Repairing and learning to re-love old items reduces the generation of new plastic materials and delays their discard date. Skip cheap, flimsy plastic, and upcycle or fix something you already have.
- **Support Local Zero Waste Retailers** Our town is rich in bulk/refill shopping options, secondhand stores, and informal neighbor-to-neighbor online groups. These communities make it easy for you to participate in a circular economy and cut ties with plastic.
- Embrace Reusable Shopping Bags Single-use plastic bag bans are unfortunately forbidden in the state of Florida, so this is the route we're left with. Remember to always bring your reusable cloth bags in with you when shopping. Leaving them at home or in the car denies these bags their purpose and the chance to contribute to our planet. If you don't possess reusable shopping bags yet, why delay?
