



Annual Program Appraisals

Command Staff annually appraise each program for performance, training, resources, accomplishments, and sustainability. Their detailed reports are available upon request.

- **5A.7 Community Risk Reduction:** GFR's four Fire Safety Inspectors completed 827 inspections of 4,437 buildings with over 28 million square feet. Inspectors followed up on 96% of the intital visits to ensure those properties provided safe environments for our neighbors. The team also completed 233 Plans Reviews; reviewed 254 special event permits; completed 42 Special Event Inspections; and conducted 204 Night Inspections to keep our entertainment areas safe.
- **5B.4. Public Education:** GFR's Fire and Life Safety Education program reached nearly 13,000 neighbors in our return to action following Covid-19 restrictions. Outreach included 49 car seat installations, 20 station tours and fire company visits, 16 public presentations, and installation of 411 smoke detectors. The Fire and Life Safety Educator also partners with GFR's Community Paramedicine Program to assist neighbors who are at risk for health and safety concerns.
- **5C.4 Investigative Services:** GFR has one full-time Investigator and one Inspector who serves as a backup Investigator. Together, they completed 90 fire cause and origin investigations and identified 13 as arson resulting in five arrests. Six additional fires were caused by juvenile firesetters. The team also provides post-fire incident support and follows up on referrals for code violations and open fire burning concerns.
- **5D.9 Domestic Preparedness:** GFR leads the way in Emergency Preparedness for the City's General Government departments. The City has followed the National Incident Management System (NIMS) since 2005. During 2022, the Emergency Management Team conducted three functional exercises of the EM system including a full-scale exercise for the biennial Airport crash response drill.
- **5E.3 Fire Suppression:** GFR has 174 positions assigned to Emergency Operations with daily minimum staffing of 42 personnel on six engines, one quint, one ladder, two towers, two squads, two District Chiefs, and two airport units. The service level has increased post-Covid and multistory construction continues to challenge the training and response capacity for the agency. The team responded to over 22,500 incidents including 1,585 alarms, 299 hazmat calls, 916 service calls, and 3,160 fire type calls. GFR continues to seek solutions to staffing losses due to retirement and other agencies, and to address aging facility needs identified in the GFR Master Plan.
- **5F.9 Emergency Medical Services:** Over 16,500 responses (74%) are for EMS requests ranging from very simple to very complex and life-threatening. GFR's EMS program is overseen by one Training Captain and guided by a contracted Medical Director. Training to keep up with evolving treatments is a continual process and the team was able to increase the number of EMS report analyses by 50%. GFR's SWAT Medics provided specialized support on over 70 incidents.
- **5G.2 Technical Rescue:** GFR had 29 members trained in all five technical rescue disciplines and 25 others learning in 2022. The LTRT 310 Team stands ready to respond to natural and man-made disasters to provide rescues from collapsed buildings, crushed vehicles, machinery, swift or deep water, confined spaces, and elevated heights. The Team responded with Task Force 8 to the devastated area of SW Florida after Hurricane Ian.



Annual Program Appraisals

5H.3 Hazardous Materials: The GFR Hazmat Team (GFRHMT) has 48 members trained as a regional asset for multiple North Florida counties and is prepared to respond statewide for chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and explosvie (CBRNE) incidents. GFRHMT technicians begin with 160 hours of training and continue their CBRNE competency training weekly throughout their careers. Training includes preparation to operate self-sufficiently for a minimum of 72 hours.

- 51.2 Aircraft Rescue and Firefighting: GFR staffs two personnel 24/7 at the Gainesville Regional Airport and operates two aircraft firefighting and rescue (ARFF) apparatus. The ARFF crew are prepared to respond to more than aircraft emergencies and can provide Basic Life Support services for medical emergencies at the Terminal and other airport property. During 2022, ARFF crews responded to 36 incidents including 22 EMS calls. They also participated in the full-scale biennial airport exercise which simulated a mass-casualty incident with over 130 patients.
- **5L.2 Community Resource Paramedicine (CRP):** Improving the quality of life for neighbors navigating social and health challenges to reduce their dependence on the emergency medical system is the primary mission of this team of enthusiastic and compassionate problem-solvers. The CRP Program is a stellar example of the success that partnerships can achieve to address coexisting needs. CRP enrolled 78 new patients in 2022, conducted 155 wellbeing visits, worked with 236 addicition recovery patients, and provided outreach to 32 homeless individuals during 2022.
- **8B.6 Training:** GFR's Training Program provides an array of education, both in-house and with other partners. The Training Chief and three Training Captains provide dedicated instruction and quality control for Medical, SWAT Medic, Technical Rescue, Fire Suppression, ARFF, and Hazmat programs. In addition to meeting mandated requirements for certifications, the training conducted by GFR is a component of the Fire Protection Classification Rating by the Insurance Services Office (ISO) which helps to reduce property insurance rates.
- **9B.13 Communications:** The accredited Combined Communications Center of the Alachua County Sheriff's Office provides E911 call-taking and Fire/EMS dispatching services. GFR works closely with the CCC Radio Users' Group to monitor, maintain, and improve communication services using an 800 MHz Trunked Radio System and an enhanced 911 system.
- **11B.6 Health and Safety / Physical Fitness:** This program focuses on wellness and injury prevention through personal protective gear inspections, fitness assessments, annual physicals, and mental health resources. GFR also contracts with a provider to support early detection and cancer prevention. A long-term goal is to secure funding to provide two sets of gear for each firefighter.

Facilities: GFR works closely with the City's Facilities staff to address daily maintenance needs and long-term planning needs. A Master Plan for facilities has recommended the replacement of several older fire stations as well as the Administration and Training facilities. An infrastructure surtax of 1/2 cent was approved by local voters in 2022 to help fund these significant projects.

Fleet: Fire Rescue apparatus are in use 24/7 and require specialized care and repair. GFR relies on the City's Fleet Department to purchase and maintain all emergency and support vehicles.
